"I wanted it to be age appropriate, Rambo is much heavier now, more brutal looking, more ponderous. There wasn't the pressure to be sleek because he doesn't take his shirt off, it wasn't about being chiselled," he says.

The Italian stallion may think he is too old to strip off in movies, but he still manages to perform his own death-defying stunts.

"I didn't want to," he laughs "the first day the stuntman severely tore his leg muscle and there was no double so I had to do them.

The actor seems to have mellowed with age, even befriending his long-term box office rival Arnold Schwarzenegger.

"At one time, Arnold and I were like Sodom and Gomorrah, Cane and Abel, very competitive," he says.

"After he became governor, we started to build a relationship. We'd go to this place called, Cafe Rome, and smoke cigars. Then they banned smoking, so the governor and I were in an alley stealing puffs talking about how to balance the budget."

violence in this film is gratuitous, but this is what's happening. The Burmese don't just

believe in killing someone they believe in psychologically damaging someone forever, like cutting their child's head off and making them keep it outside their house until it rots.'

For the cast and crew, shooting the new Rambo movie in the politically unstable region was as daring as any daredevil mission Rambo has undertaken.

The Burmese army tried to intimidate Stallone so he would abandon the project.

'They called every night for weeks saying they were going to kill me, but they were very polite. They'd say 'you are making a Burma film, you cannot do this, this could be you to die, thank you' and hang up," he says.

The hostile jungle environment also caused problems. He says: "There were lots of scorpion and snake bites, a lot of rashes and dysentery, so many of the cast were in hospital on drips."

But, he admits, it was worth it to uncover the atrocities that are currently ongoing in the country
