THE COUNTRY'S economy is in ruins, there are no jobs for school leavers – but the class of 2009 proved they couldn't care less as they partied on in one of Europe's hottest beach destinations.

Students from Ireland's most exclusive schools have been living it up in the Cypriot resort of Ayia Napa, with a fortnight of booze, bikinis and bad behaviour.

Partying

The day starts around six o'clock for most of the teens, who shun the beach in favour of all-night partying. After a quick meal it's time to hit the nightclubs.

Running the gauntlet of the main strip, the young drinkers are lured into the nightclubs by young, attractive touts offering cheap booze deals.
